




## The Jesus Ship



## 28 FOOT SAILING SHIP

Moshe and Yuval Lufan, brothers and fishermen from Kibbutz Ginosar, discovered the Ancient Galilee Boat buried in the mud near the shore of the Sea of Galilee. The boat was positively dated to the First Century C.E., ... the boat which could have been the very same

vessel on which Jesus sailed the Sea of Galilee. The vessel is 9 meters long, 2.5 meters wide, and 1.25 meters high. Its measurements suit those used by ancient fisherman employing a seine, or dragnet, "cast into the sea" as described in Matthew 13:47-48.

## SHIP OR BOAT?

In the Greek the word "ship" means a sailing ship. The Greek word for boat is different. All fishing built like a boat hull sailing vessels were commercial vessels and were referred to as ships. The word boat was used very seldom (twice in the KJV NT) and referred to small rowing vessels.

Ship also was used as a metaphor for the church building. Many churches are upside down, to remind the congregation that they are in a ship with Jesus, on sometimes stormy seas.
